Formed in 1993 by Martín Santangelo and his Bessie award-winning wife, Soledad Barrio, Noche Flamenca has been hailed by critics everywhere for its transcendent and deeply emotional performances. Born of passion and the desire to present the authentic form of flamenco to audiences throughout the globe, Noche Flamenca is noted for creating a diverse theatrical body of work that expresses the rigorous, spellbinding aesthetic of flamenco and exceeds the

highest artistic expectations. All aspects of flamenco - dance, song, and music are interrelated and given equal weight, creating a true communal spirit within the company - the very heart and soul of flamenco. Performance highlights include Lincoln Center, the Joyce Theater, Joe's Pub and Noche Flamenca's home base at the West Park Presbyterian Church in NYC. The group also tours extensively across the U.S., Canada, Europe, the Middle East, Argentina, and Australia. Noche Flamenca has been recognized with awards from the National Dance Project, the MAP Fund, the National Endowment for the Arts, the Lucille Lortel Award for Special Theatrical Experience, an Exceptional Artist Award for Soledad Barrio from Dance Magazine, the Vilcek Prize in Dance and a Bessie Award for Outstanding Performer at the Joyce Theatre. New England treasure Becky Bass is known for her "euphoric steel pan playing, soulful voice, and powerful stage presence." A native of St. Croix, Becky is thrilled to share her exhilarating native Caribbean Soul steel pan music solo, or with her band for special events from intimate gatherings to weddings, festivals, and large-scale fundraisers. A graduate of Brown University in Theatre Arts & Performance Studies, she is a two-time Urban Music Award winner as well as an

accomplished film, stage, and TV actress. She plays regularly with the groups Zili Musik, Natural Element, and Sidy Maiga & Afrimanding throughout New England. This summer she made headlines as the solo vocalist for the New Jersey Symphony's world premiere of Farah (Joy) for Voice and Orchestra. Composer Daniel Bernard Roumain (DBR) wrote the piece specifically for Becky's "incomparable voice." Past performances include appearances at the National Gallery of Art, New York City's Lincoln Center, Chicago's Underground WonderBar, and the Off-Broadway theater LaMaMa. ABOUT SIDY MAIGA



Sidy Maiga is a Djembe Master from Mali. As a teenager, he apprenticed under some of Mali's most renowned Master Drummers. Sidy has been an active member of the local music scene, playing not only traditional Malian music, but also a fusion of Malian music with Latin, Blues, and Brazilian. His love for sharing his music and culture with the community inspired him to begin Afrika Nyaga, a West Africa Dance and Drum Festival. This festival brings together both local and international

musicians and dancers to perform across Rhode Island. Maiga has received the MacColl-Johnson Fellowship (2012), the RISCA Folk Arts Fellowship (2012and 2022). Sidy has performed on stages with many international artists. Sidy has released two albums, Maliden (2011) and Africa United (2014), which features musicians from across the world. He's now recording his third album. Maiga has since pushed his craft further by completing his degree at Berklee College of Music (2020), where he studied music production, business, and composition. Sidy's djembe that he had been playing for over 20 years is currently being displayed at the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston.

DJ Brazao developed a passion for music early on, influenced by his father, a drummer for the renowned group Os Tubarões. Though initially drawn to drums, he found his calling in DJing after organizing parties with friends Jorge and Adilson. Encouraged by his surroundings, he delved into DJ basics, aided by his friends and seasoned DJs like Nery Nos Manera and DJ Ivan LLuv. Starting at local events and gradually progressing to nightclubs, DJ Brazao overcame stage fright with

Adilson's support. A pivotal moment came when Adilson left him alone to DJ, forcing him to conquer his fears. This experience propelled his confidence, leading to relentless practice, equipment upgrades, and a deep dive into music genres.
